WGBH helps preschoolers prepare for school through the Ready to Learn initiative, which provides parents and caregivers with support materials that extend the value of WGBH's award-winning children's television programs. WGBH also is reaching out to teachers to help ensure that every classroom has the best seat for learning. We created Teachers' Domain to put the best multimedia resources and lesson plans at the fingertips of educators from coast to coast. A searchable Web index of extensive K-12 science resources, Teachers' Domain materials are correlated with national and state standards. Nearly 100,000 teachers have signed up for the free service, (teachersdomain.org) with 4,000 more registering every month. b Broadcasting The WGBH Educational Foundation holds the licenses for eight broadcast operations: WGBH 2, WGBH 44 (officially, WGBX), and WGBH 89.7 in Boston, WNCK 89.5 in Nantucket, which transmits the WGBH 89.7 lineup on Cape Cod without technical interference, WCAI 90.1 in Martha's Vineyard, WNAN 91.1 in Nantucket and WZAI 94.3 in Brewster, and Springfield's WGBY 57 and digital channels (seen on Comcast) WGBH World, WGBH Create, 'GBH Kids, WGBH On Demand, and WGBH High Definition, Boston Kids & Family TV, for Boston cable subscribers and WGBY 57 digital channels. All are viewer- and listener-supported public broadcasting stations. ACCESS TECHNOLOGIES. Some 36 million Americans with disabilities rely on advances created by WGBH for equal access to the media that enrich all our lives. WGBH's Media Access Group has been a pioneer in access technologies since 1972, when The Caption Center at WGBH began providing closed captioning for viewers who are deaf or hard-of-hearing. In 1990, WGBH pioneered access for blind or visually impaired viewers by creating Descriptive Video Services (R) (DVS (R)), which offers supplementary audio narration of television programs. The year 2003 marked another media access first, as WGBH and AOL partnered to provide closed captions for select multimedia content on the Web. In 1992, WGBH married two technologies to create MoPix (R), a captioning and description system that enables people with hearing or visual disabilities to enjoy first-run movies in theaters. Since then, WGBH has encouraged theater owners nationwide to adopt MoPix while simultaneously lobbying Hollywood studios to caption and describe their new releases. Each year, the number of MoPix installations across North America increases and the number of Hollywood films, home videos, and DVDs available with captions and video description on the day and date of their release continues to grow. The Media Access Group's research and development arm, the CPB/WGBH National Center for Accessible Media (NCAM), is dedicated to increasing media access for people with disabilities in their homes, school, workplaces, and communities. NCAM also created closed-captioning standards for digital television. NCAM's mission is to expand access to current and emerging media for people with disabilities, to explore how existing access technologies may benefit other populations, to represent its constituents in industry, policy, and legislative circles, and to provide access to educational and media technologies for special needs students. c Programming and Production TELEVISION PROGRAMMING. Widely acknowledged as PBS's pre-eminent production house, WGBH is the source of one-third of all prime-time programming seen on public television nationwide. WGBH productions and projects earned more than 50 awards in 2006, including two George Foster Peabody Awards, our industry's equivalent of the Pulitzer Prize, for American Experience's Two Days in October and Masterpiece Theatre's Bleak House. And a Alfred I duPont-Columbia University Award for Frontline's The Age of AIDS. WGBH's ongoing nationally broadcast productions for PBS include American Experience, Antiques Roadshow, Antiques Roadshow FYI, Arthur, Between the Lions, Curious George, Evening at Pops, Fetch! with Ruff Ruffman, Food Trip with Todd English, Frontline, Frontline/World, Materpiece Theatre, Mystery!, The New Yankee Workshop, Nova, Nova ScienceNow, Postcards from Buster, Simply Ming, The Victory Garden, Zoom. WGBH is dedicated to creating programs for WGBH 2 and WGBH 44 broadcast that examine issues of particular interest to viewers in our local region. Viewers throughout New England with Comcast Digital Cable or digital receivers now can access an expanded menu of WGBH programs through WGBH World, WGBH Create, 'GBH Kids, WGBH On Demand, and WGBH High Definition. WGBH's ongoing local television series are Basic Black, Greater Boston, La Plaza. RADIO PROGRAMMING. WGBH is an important source of programs heard on public radio stations from coast to coast. Our national radio productions include New Year's Day from Vienna, Sound & Spirit, The World. WGBH 89.7 (on Cape Cod, heard on WNCK 89.5) is New England's arts and culture station, serving the community with a mix of classical music, jazz and NPR news. WGBH Radio has been a local resource since October 1951, when we signed on the air with alive radio broadcast of the Boston Symphony Orchestra's first program of the season. In 2006, more than 300 performances were aired live or recorded by WGBH for later broadcast. These performances provide exposure to both up-and-coming and established artists and deliver live jazz, blues, classical, and folk to music fans everywhere. WGBH 89.7's local productions include A Celtic Sojourn, Blues on WGBH, Classics in the Morning, Classical Performances, Folk on WGBH, Jazz Decades, Jazz from Studio Four, Jazz Gallery, Jazz with Eric in the Evening, The Jazz Songbook, WGBH Symphonycast. WGBH's Cape and Islands NPR stations, WCAI 90.1, WNAN 91.1 and WZAI 94.3, supply listeners with the best of NPR programming mixed with locally produced features that capture the Cape's unique sights and sounds. Local productions for Cape and Islands include The Point. WEB. PBS's Web site, pbs.org, is the most-visited dot-org on the Internet, and WGBH is its single largest production source. WGBH's sites are rich online resources that extend the impact and value of our television productions and live on long after the programs have aired. They provide complete, unedited interviews, primary research resources, streaming video, and teaching tools for classroom use and lifelong learning, as well as educational games and other interactive elements. Our Web sites attract 11 million visitors every month to pbs.org. WGBH also has a vibrant Web site, wgbh.org, focusing on our New England-area viewer- and listenership. Today, the Web is proving to be a remarkable platform for extending the reach of our radio services through streaming audio. Listeners can stream our stations on demand from wgbh.org or select from a growing menu of online programs. The WGBH Forum Network, wgbh.org/forum, captures lectures presented all around New England by community leaders, policy makers, and world-class scholars and artists and turns them into a permanent online library, available on demand.
